
Zumar Foundation works in Uganda, Kenya and Somalia. Kampala is our headquarter and we have affiliate office in Kenya and Somalia.

Zumar Foundation provided learning materials including, textbooks, teacher guides, and recreational materials: All the 1,500 enrolled students received learning kits and 55 teachers also received teacher guide packages.

The main purposes of this project were:

- Increasing access to education for vulnerable children in our areas jurisdiction in Somalia
- supplying learning materials kits and teachers package guide respectively to the vulnerable students and their teachers to make learning, materials available to encourage and promote the value of education.



Water Projects



At Zumar Foundation, we strove to give Needy communities safe access to clean water.

Highlights

- We refurbished broken water systems; constructed handpump water wells and developed Artesian boreholes powered by solar system.
- To ensure the long-term sustainability of Water facilities, we trained 83 Water Management Committees to maintain and repair water points.

291,040 People accessed drinking safe and clean water.



70 Handpump water wells are construcrted



12 Motorized solar-piped water systems constructed with 96 taps.
